John F. Kennedy High School History



John F. Kennedy High School opened in September 1966 with grades 10 and 11. It became the third high school in the Bellmore-Merrick Central High School District. The Bellmore-Merrick Central High School District #3 was one of only three central high school districts in New York State.

The district at that time was comprised of Wellington C. Mepham and Sanford H. Calhoun High Schools, Jerusalem Avenue, Merrick Avenue, Grand Avenue and Brookside Junior Highs. Boundaries of the newly established Kennedy High School would include south of Sunrise Highway between Meadowbrook Parkway and east to the Wantagh border, including the towns of South Merrick and South Bellmore. Boundaries were to shift as the population changed and demographics over the years forced the closing of Jerusalem Avenue and Brookside Junior Highs.

The 9th graders were then added to the three high schools, changing the junior high schools to middle schools for 7th and 8th graders. Today, the Bellmore-Merrick Central High School District consists of two middle schools that feed into the three high schools. Kennedy is the only high school that draws students from both Grand Avenue and Merrick Avenue Middle Schools.

Population Changes: Class sizes have varied from the 400's in the early 1970's, to 500-600 in the 1980's, and has declined to the low 200's in the 1990's due to demographics. In 1966, with grades 10 and 11, Kennedy's population was over 980 students. By the late 1970's, it rose to 2200 students in grades 10, 11, and 12. In 1996, the population for all four grades totaled 830 students. Today, Kennedy High School boasts an enrollment of 1110 students.

In the fifty-year history of John F. Kennedy High School, there have only been four building principals. The current principal is Lorraine Poppe, holding the distinction of being the longest serving principal in the history of the school (twenty-two years):

Anthony Yeneralo - September 1966 - June 1972 Morten Tannenbaum - September 1972 - June 1984 Fredrick Cohen - September 1984 - June 1995 Lorraine Poppe - September 1995 - Present





Gregory Maushart



Greg Maushart was a member of the "original" faculty at Kennedy High School, serving as a member of the physical education staff from 1966 -1992. He began his career in Bellmore-Merrick in 1960, being first assigned to Grand Avenue Junior High School and coaching numerous sports, including football, basketball, baseball, lacrosse and track.

When Kennedy High School opened its doors, Coach Maushart was assigned to the staff and became Kennedy's first football coach, a position he held for over twenty years. He led the Cougar Football Squad to their first (and only) undefeated football season in 1973, earning him "Coach of the Year" honors. Additionally, Coach Maushart coached the Varsity Lacrosse and Track teams.

Coach Greg Maushart's influence on the students at Kennedy High School went far beyond the gymnasium and beyond the school day. As a teacher, coach and role model, Greg Maushart is recognized for his commitment to the students and student-athletes of Kennedy and is deserving of his placement on the Cougar Nation Wall of Honor.

Shula Hirsch began her teaching career at Kennedy High School in 1966 as an original member of the English Department, teaching grade level courses, Public Speaking and Jewish Literature. In her twenty years at JFK, Shula demonstrated a deep commitment to the students and families of South Bellmore and Merrick.

As a founding member and long- time advisor to the JFK Speech and Debate team, Shula spent long hours well beyond the school day working with students to improve their skills in the art in debate, carefully preparing them for competitions on the local, county and state level. Shula's influence on the students in her classroom and on her Speech and Debate team was far reaching; so many of them have and still keep in touch with her.

ATribute to Coach Greg Maushart

I am a graduate of John F. Kennedy High School and one of the great privileges of my life was being a member of the John F. Kennedy High School Football Team and playing for Coach Maushart during the 1969, 1970 and 1971 seasons. I was fortunate to have played on very successful teams during those years, which success came against very good competition. Far more important to me, however, than our success on the field, was that playing for Coach Maushart taught me many things which I have drawn upon throughout my professional career, including the importance of preparation and the recognition that through effort, discipline and sacrifice, any of the goals that we set for ourselves in our lives can be attained.

While there are many stories I could convey about Coach Maushart, perhaps one that is representative of how inspirational he was to his players relates to a game we played against Long Beach High School in 1971. Back then most of us played on defense, offense and special teams and we rarely came off the field during games. That year Long Beach had a number of track athletes on their team and we spent most of the first half chasing them up and down the field. At halftime we were behind by a couple of touchdowns and I vividly remember walking into the gym, dropping to the floor and lying flat on my back due to total exhaustion. Coach clearly sensed that despite the score that his players were competing as hard as we could. I remember that the first thing he told us during halftime was that we were going to win the game. While lying on the floor I kept wondering what game he was watching because it could not have been the same game that I was playing. Nevertheless, in as calm a voice as I could ever remember him speaking in, he instilled in us the confidence that if we reached deep inside ourselves, that we would find the strength to be successful. Of course, we went on to hold our opponents scoreless in the second half and scored the winning touchdown at the end of the game. Our success that day was more about his confidence in us and his inspiring words, than it was about our level of play.


The late sixties and early seventies were a time of great political and social turmoil in our country and it was easy for many of my high school classmates to become distracted by activities that were not conducive to excelling in the classroom or to living as responsible citizens outside of school. With respect to his players, however, Coach Maushart never allowed us to become distracted from our goals and never accepted anything less from us than maximum effort in the classroom and on the football field. It was this discipline that he instilled in his players that helped me in my academic and professional success following high school.

I want to congratulate Coach Maushart on this great honor of being inducted in the John F. Kennedy High School's Hall of Fame. For me, and I am certain that I speak for all of his former players, it was simply an honor to play football for him. I also want to thank Coach Maushart for everything he taught me and I want him to know that as I look back on my life, that he was a tremendous influence on me and that without the lessons he taught me about life, I would never have achieved anything close to the success I enjoy today.
